HBAS Operating Systems Upgrade Report

2022-2023 saw a significant change to the operating processes of the Hobsons Bay Arts Society.

Driven by the need to both reduce the operating burden of the society and increase our ability to deliver more events, including exhibitions and workshops, we have:

- 1. Moved submissions for all exhibitions online using the Jotform platform. This gives the society the ability to greatly simplify the delivery of events, centralising all the exhibition data in one place and allowing the simple generation of catalogues and exhibition support material. For members, it provides a simple online portal for the submission of artworks to exhibitions.
- 2. Established a highly secure online membership database (Airtable) which enables the efficient updating and application of membership details.
- 3. Automated the payment of membership fees using the internationally recognised "Square" payment gateway linked to our membership database using the Jotform payment integration. This largely removes the time-consuming manual membership renewal process.
- 4. Transitioned our accounting software with its limited capabilities and time-consuming processes to the modern Xero accounting system which directly integrates with our payment system (Square and Jotform).
- 5. Started moving a number of our workshops and other events to the Eventbrite platform, providing a reliable way to ticket and market events.

HBAS has had a busier than usual calendar of exhibitions this year as part of our Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) with Hobsons Bay City Council, where the exhibition space in the council foyer, Hobsons Bay Civic Centre(HBCC), was handed over to us to present a range of art installations across the year.

A new curation committee was formed to facilitate 3 new exhibitions, headed by Sheree McCrum and Vicki Tyrrell, who have done a wonderful job negotiating the steep learning curve and challenges involved in presenting them. - April: 5X7 Art Prize HBAS's biggest community art event of the year (Louis Joel).









Monday 28 November: Working in tandem, Kirsten Craggs and Christine MacPherson demonstrated the techniques of dry felting, After a talk about method and materials, we all made at least one cute little animal to experience this craft work. What fun we all had!


Monday 27 February: The year kicked off with a showcasing by Jos van Hulsen (who did the sculpture outside Louis Joel) of his quirky industrial sculptures and work with found materials. For those who missed it, check out Joss's website at (jos@postindustrialdesign.com.au)

Monday 27 March: In his packed-out Activity Night "Drawing techniques – a taster of 3 different methods" David Payne provided a fascinating map of approaches to drawing and a taster of just some of these (Sight Size, Observational Drawing, Using Geometric Shapes, Unit of Measure). This was a lead in to his 2 full day workshops later in the semester focusing on 2 methods in more depth.

Monday 24 April: Haiying (Helene) Gao took us into the fascinating (and highly disciplined) world of Chinese painting with ink on rice paper. With the next day being a public Holiday (Anzac Day), some parents brought along their children and since 2023 is the Chinese year of the Rabbit, we all left with drawings of our own rabbits!

Monday 22 May: Gaye Pereira Jackson, our wonderful president, introduced us to the liberating world of Doodle Art, Zentangling and Intuitive Drawing. We all went home with colourful and quite magical renditions of elephants, vegetation and the unpredictable products of our minds!

Monday 26 June: Lorraine Rogers was generous and encouraging as she helped us make our own layered textile artworks, having been inspired by her gorgeous creations. She made up small kits of fabric for people to play around with, producing artworks that featured Poppies and/or Seascapes,


